President's Message

This is a magical time of year in Pasadena. Not only is our weather beautiful, but the annual **Tournament of Roses** is in full swing. The Rose Court has been selected and a queen will be named soon. College football contenders for the Rose Bowl are battling it out up and down the Pacific coast and throughout the Midwest (and beyond). In addition, we will host the final BCS Championship Game here in Pasadena.

As we enter the holiday season here in Pasadena, I want to note the contributions our New Year events make toward our city and our region. A just-released study from *Micronomics* and the *Los* Angeles Tourism and Convention Board found that Tournament events for 2013 contributed \$164 million in direct spending in our local and regional economy. This was money spent by those attending Tournament events, and at hotels, restaurants, theme parks, tours and more. It includes \$5.6 million spent on float design and construction, \$3.7 million by visiting Tournament participants and \$14 million spent by the Tournament to stage the parade and game.

The Tournament and the Chamber share a long history. Our predecessor, the Pasadena Board of Trade, hosted an entry in the first Tournament of Roses in 1889. In 1895, when the Valley Hunt Club was unable to organize the parade, the Board of Trade understood that the event was too important for Pasadena. Two directors of the Board of Trade were appointed to find a solution so the parade could continue. In November, 1895, recognizing that they could not stage the event, the Board of Trade hosted a community meeting where directors C.D. Daggett and Thos. Coleman proposed the Tournament of Roses Association be formed. On January 1, 1896, the parade went off as usual, with the eighth entry from the Pasadena Board of Trade among the participants.

As we approach the 125th parade and 100th game, the Chamber has a chance to celebrate at our annual President's Breakfast on December 6th at the Sheraton Pasadena. We hope you can join us to honor 2014 Tournament President R. Scott Jenkins and the contributions the Tournament has made to Pasadena and our region.

President's Breakfast on December 5th Honors Tournament of Roses and President R. Scott Jenkins

The Pasadena Chamber of Commerce will honor Tournament of Roses Association President R. Scott Jenkins at the annual President's Breakfast at the Sheraton Pasadena on Thursday, December 5th. Breakfast begins at 7:30 a.m. followed by a festive celebratory program.

Mr. Jenkins presides over the 100th Rose Bowl Game and 125th Rose Parade. He is also a partner in longstanding Chamber member law firm **Hahn and Hahn, LLP**.



Mr. Jenkins has been a volunteer member of the Tournament since 1982 and was elected to the Executive Committee in 2003. Throughout his extensive Tournament career, Jenkins has served on many committees and was chair of four: Formation Area, Float Entries, Queen and Court, and Services and Properties committees. He has also been involved with community and church organizations in Pasadena and San Marino.

tress, Sacsayhuaman Ruins, Qengo and enjoy an Andean folklore show.




