HISTORICAL INFORMATION

The Romanesque Room is part of the Hotel Green property and is a Pasadena Historic Monument. It was designed by Los Angeles-based architect Frederick Roehrig. He combined the best of Moorish, Spanish, and Victorian stylistic elements, blending domes, arches, pillars, balconies and verandas into a building of structural steel with brick walls and concrete floors, making it Pasadena's first fireproof building.

Construction on the hotel was initiated in 1887 by developer Edward C. Webster, between Raymond Avenue and the Santa Fe Railroad tracks.

Webster's later insolvency led to Col. George Gill Green of the Patent Medicine Business acquiring the unfinished building, which he doubled in size and completed in 1894.

In its prime, Hotel Green became the social center in Pasadena, and was a lavish resort for easterners and others escaping harsh winters. It held many high society events and receptions for significant visitors. Due to the hotel's great success, Green began building an addition, known as "Castle Green," which opened January 16, 1899.

The Romanesque Room ballroom served as the elegant dining room of the hotel, hosting many extravagant dinners. But at the end of the resort era in 1924, investors divided the hotel into individually owned units and low-income rentals units. The ballroom was later boarded up and used for storage, until it was rescued and fully restored in 1984 by Ron Hobbs of Castle Catering.

When Ron and his wife Starla decided to retire, they asked Tony and Ann Lancaster if they would be interested in taking over. They accepted and acquired the business in June of 2019.

The Romanesque Room proudly hosts weddings, galas, quincenaeras, and celebrations of all kinds for up to 300 people. For now, we are opening our lovely patio for dining with a view of "Castle Green," in the hopes that we will soon be able to resume large celebrations in-doors.
